1. Engineering Services Contract with Garver LLC for 2018 Water Tank and Water Quality Evaluations

Periodic water tank inspections are both a Best Management Practice and a requirement by the Arkansas Department of Health. The water quality analysis is requested to assist the City with reviewing the best methods for maintaining water quality within the City's water distribution system.

Staff recommends approval of the engineering services contract with Garver LLC in the not to exceed amount of \$154,000.00 for the 2018 Water Tank and Water Quality Evaluations as further documented in the attached proposed contract.

2. Supplemental Agreement with Allgeier, Martin & Associates for Electrical Engineering Services

Staff recommends approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 1 with Allgeier, Martin and Associates, Inc. for additional electrical engineering services in the not-to-exceed amount of \$46,144.00. The requested services include review, calculations and recommendations for the City's <u>potable water pump stations</u> to provide compliance with current Electrical Codes and updated arc flash safety requirements. The proposed additional cost will increase the existing contract from \$480,049.00 to \$526,193.00. The contract will provide recommendations and document requirements to assure compliance with current codes, prepare for required electrical replacements and improvements and arc flash electrical safety. The current contract with Allgeier, Martin and Associates, Inc is for electrical engineering services at the Noland WWTP and West Side WWTP.

3. Construction Contract Change Order No. 1 for the Cured-In-Place-Pipe term (renewable) sewer rehabilitation contract with Insituform Technologies

The Cured-In-Place-Pipe Contract with Insituform Technologies, LLC. was approved by the City Council on April 3, 2018.

Staff recommends approval of Change Order No.1 for the Cured-In-Place-Pipe term (renewable) contract with Insituform Technologies, LLC. to add additional pipe segments to the 2018 proposed sewer rehabilitation work plan.

The additional lengths and diameters of pipe for the 2018 sewer rehabilitation work plan are based upon what was discovered in the City's recent Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Survey (SSES inspections) and City field work.

The proposed change order includes additional quantities for 6", 8", 10" and 12" diameter sewer pipe, and adding diameters and quantities for 15", 18" and 24" diameter sewer rehabilitation.

Based upon the additional diameters and quantities, the proposed 2018 contract cost will be increased from \$248,501.00 to \$528,693.55.

4. Goshen Ground Water Storage Tank and Benson Pressure Plane Improvements
The City authorized Hawkins-Weir at their October 3, 2017 Council Meeting to evaluate
elevated water storage tank options to replace the Benson Standpipe and the Benson
Mountain Pump Station, to facilitate refurbishing the Goshen Ground Tank, to evaluate
tank mixing and disinfection by-product control systems for both tanks, and water
distribution improvements on Fire Tower Road Spur. Staff will discuss the projects that
will be combined to perform the improvements.
