BACKGROUND:

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) administers the Assistance to Firefighters (AFG) Grants. The purpose of the AFG Program is to enhance, through direct financial assistance, the health and safety of firefighting personnel. These Brush Truck Vehicles will allow for enhanced response capabilities specific to wildland and brush fires within our urban interface City surroundings.

DISCUSSION:

The Fire Department would like to utilize this opportunity to submit an application for the AFG grant program to request funding to purchase two brush truck vehicles. These apparatus will ensure quality wildland/brush fire vehicles are available to respond to our city's fire response needs.

BUDGET/STAFF IMPACT:

If the grant is awarded, the City would incur the matching grant amount of 10% which will be approximately \$30,000 of the total grant amount requested of \$300,000. The funding for this match will come from ACT 833 Funds.
