### 5. Monthly numbers.

In May, three grading permits were approved. Of the 29.95 Acres of development, 2 acres was tree canopy, and 1 acre was preserved. 255 trees will be planted as part of the landscape requirements for the projects.

Urban Forestry has reviewed 108 acres of development year to date, and 30 acres were canopy covered. 70% of 30 acres of tree canopy has been preserved. 946 trees will be planted as part of the landscape requirements.

- D. Planning Commissioner Paxton- Commissioner Kris Paxton suggested planning staff look into prairie land overlay districts as opposed to strictly tree mitigation policies such as the city has now. Sometimes, trees shouldn't go in wetland areas, and the code should have nuance to reflect that idea, he said."We could possibly incentivize solar or some other option other than tree preservation or tree planting for street trees," Paxton said. "Like, instead of street trees we have prairie land grasses in the right of way."
