DISCUSSION:






Wilson Park Census Blocks




How... Methodology—Primary Considerations

- Preserving the cores of existing Wards
- Create Wards of substantially equal populations
- Provide for expected growth
- Ward boundary must follow Census Blocks
- Coordinate with the Washington County Clerk and Election Commission Offices to keep as many precincts intact as possible




Current Wards






Recommended Plan
